3rd SUNDAY OF EASTER

14th & 15th APRIL 2018

Christianity is not founded on dreams or visions but on the historical reality of Christ who died and rose from the dead. Jesus now is a man as he was before but with a glorified body. Jesus himself proves that he is a reality, eating and speaking with the disciples. Jesus lives in our midst. He is so close to us that he dwells within our hearts. What brings us to church every day or every week? It is the word of the one who is present in our midst. He commanded his disciples "Do this in commemoration of me". The greater the conviction, the easier to keep his words: the more we keep his words, the more we know him and love him.

The Gospel tells us today how God always leads people into an experience of community and table fellowship (Luke 24:36-48). The disciples were unable to fully recognize him on the road, but they did recognize him in the breaking of the bread. The striking humanity of Jesus at table will finally convince them that he is alive.

In spite of the testimony from the women, the disciples still could not believe their eyes when Jesus appeared before them. Jesus showed his wounds and challenged his followers to "touch" him. Holiness was not only a matter of ecstasy, touching the transcendent, while leaving the world behind. The believer encounters the Risen Christ through the bodily senses. His followers saw, touched, and heard the Risen One. We see, hear, and touch Christ today through the sacraments, through shared witness and service to others.

The Eucharist is a summary of Jesus' life, a call to lay down one's life for others. The breaking of bread is also a powerful sign of unity. When we break bread, it is a means of sharing in the body of Christ. A further union is established through the "partaking" of the same loaf – the union between all the members of the celebrating community.

The Eucharist makes the members of the body celebrate their oneness, oneness experienced on three levels: one in Christ, one with each other, and one in service to the world. What Jesus was unable to do in accompanying them, conversing with them, interpreting the Word of God, he accomplished with the Eucharistic gesture. It is often the very ordinary moments of table fellowship that bring about the realization that we are human, loving, loveable and genuinely interested in others. Let us always approach the table of the Eucharist and have the same experience of the Risen Christ.
