Jealousy is an emotion that refers to the thoughts or feelings of insecurity, fear, concern, and envy over relative lack of possessions, status or something of great personal value. Jealousy is distinct from *envy*. Jealousy is a typical experience in human relationships and it has been observed in infants as young as five months. Jealousy can either be suspicious or reactive. Envy and jealousy travel together but are different emotions both are negative and can make you feel miserable and ruin your relationships. *Envy* is a two-person relationship: I want *what* you have. *Jealousy* is a three-person triangle: I want the *recognition* you have from others. *Envy* is resentment toward others because of their possessions or success. *Jealousy* is when a third person threatens a relationship—you are afraid to lose someone you love in the hands of other. Jealousy is an anticipatory emotion that causes us to take precautionary measures. Jealousy and envy are natural instincts. *Envy* is a reaction to lacking something; *Jealousy* is a reaction to the threat of losing something or someone. Jealousy and envy are still the cause of most current conflicts both in the professional and personal world. Envy drives to self-sabotage causing wars and other conflicts. Jealousy originates from the prospect of failure; envy from actual 'failure.' Buddhism teaches us that whatever causes our suffering has its roots in the Three Poisons: Ignorance, Hate, and Greed. *Ignorance* is the mother of all poisons. It's the belief that things are fixed and permanent. When we see that someone is doing better than us, rather than focus on how we can improve, we get stuck on the current status. There are always people that are better and worse than us. When we compare, we see things as static. We look outside what others have rather than inside what we can change. *Hate* arises from ignorance. We believe the world revolves around us. Our society is a system—when we disconnect from it, we start seeing everyone as a competitor or an enemy. Envy and jealousy are just defense mechanisms. *Greed* is the fantasy that adding more stuff will provide personal gratification. Greed is also based on your need to protect your status—you believe that objects define who you are. Attachment motivates envy and jealousy. Most of us have experienced jealousy at some stage in our lives. Jealousy is everywhere: in families between partners, parents to children, between siblings; in the workplace between employees, with their bosses and with competitors; in schools between students, between teachers and pupils, amongst staff and so on. Jealousy begins with the recognition that another is living a greater degree of their life than that which we are choosing to live. Jealousy is thus born from a refusal to take responsibility for our past choices. In the life of the church we will certainly find people who are for and against us. Envy is the root cause of dissension and it is a thief of peace. We find it not only in the church but also in business, between friends, husband and wife, parents and children and in every sphere of life. Jealousy can blind us, misguide us and prevent the growth of good. Jesus taught us that God is our Father who lets the Sun shine both on the good and bad alike, the just and the unjust. From Jesus we have to learn to be tolerant and generous. We must understand that every person has a right to his own thoughts and ideas. We may dislike their words and ideas but we should not dislike that person. In today's readings we see the followers of Jesus preventing a person from doing good and also in the first reading preventing two people from prophesying because they do not belong to their group. We all have hundreds of opportunities everyday to do good. We always need helpers to do good. Whatever good thing we do will be a blessing for someone and for ourselves also. So let us like five fingers join together and do as much good as we can and encourage others also to do good. Thanks to all the groups working for the good of the parish.
