**33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME- B**  
**17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER 2018**

As we approach the end of the Liturgical year, the Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. Jesus' words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death. The world as we know will come to an end someday. Even scientifically this is true, although it could be millions of years in the future. Of course, if we humans continue on our roads of self-destruction and development of weapons of mass destruction, the world as we know it might end earlier. We simply don't know when or how the world will end. But we do know for what end it was created: to give glory to God. In these days at the end of Ordinary Time we are so concerned about knowing when the end of the world will be. I think it is because we want the chance to change our lives and play the right game in the end. For many who follow the Lord Jesus, today's reading can sound scary and alarming. But if we are committed to the Lord Jesus, then we must trust Him entirely. Today's readings invite us to meditate on our own death also. This is a means of reminding us that everything in this world comes to an end. We will die. So we must learn to think about death and what it means. Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples and us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for us. The chaos in heaven symbolizes the fall of the old order that will be replaced by a new one. Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. All of us are waiting for the second coming of Jesus. We recite the Creed at Mass and proclaim that Jesus "will come again to judge the living and the dead." The New Testament writers used the Greek word Parousia which means the arrival and presence of a king, to describe this second coming of Jesus. On that day all human beings will be judged in the presence of the glorified Christ, our King. When is he coming? Nobody knows. We only have to wait and do good works and be of service with our fellow human being. As we wait for Jesus to come again, we need to build not so much stone temples but communities of love, of service, of sharing, of forgiveness. Then he will find us ready since we are doing his work. Many of the early Christians thought that persecution was also a sign of the end of the world. Jesus, however, reminds us that it is an integral part of the Church's ongoing life. Christianity and persecution will go hand in hand. Jesus tells us strongly that we ought to remain close to him and be firm in our faith and the ultimate victory will be ours. Yes, there will be an end of time. To many people the end of the world is tragic. Christianity thinks it not as an end but rather a beginning - an event not to be afraid of. Our fear is natural because of the unknown but our fear could also mask a lack of firm belief in the resurrection. Our faith tells us that there is no need to live in fear and anxiety regarding the future. We are invited to seek and find him in all things, in every person, in every place, in every experience. He will come surely in his glory and majesty to judge the whole human race. So let us prepare ourselves for the future by loving and serving others in every possible occasion.
