4TH SUNDAY OF LENT-C 30TH &31ST MARCH 2019

We can give different titles to today's Gospel as the parable of the "Prodigal son" or "the Merciful Father". There is a great search for happiness and fulfillment in life. There are many attractions in life, there are many voices saying to us, "Follow me" or, "Follow your desires and you will find happiness. The prodigal son went in search of happiness. He thought that he could find happiness in a life of debauchery. He tried to find happiness by satisfying his every desire whether moral or immoral. This led him to live with the pigs in the piggery. But true happiness is not to be found outside of ourselves but within ourselves, in our own hearts. But the best offer of happiness is from God our Father. In leaving with his inheritance in hand, the son had rejected all the values of his heritage, everything the father represented. The son gradually began to see the emptiness of his miserable life and longs to return home. The father gave him the freedom to leave but when the son comes to his senses, undergoing a conversion experience, he is welcomed with outstretched arms. We leave home every time we lose faith in the voice that calls us the Beloved and follow the voices that offer a great variety of ways to win the love we so much desire. Note that the father takes the initiative. He does not wait for the son to come to him. It is the father who makes the first move and runs a long way. The father has not forgotten his son. He has kept unchanged his affection and esteem for him and has always wanted him to return. He reveals no anger or disappointment. Imagine yourself at the return, as described in the parable: "He ran to his son, embraced him, and kissed him." The son says to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son." *No matter how irresponsible you are, no matter what you've done, God will take you back. God will say: Everything is okay now.* God will always take back with open arms anyone who returns to Him with even a little humility and contrition. The journey home is often full of difficulties. One of the greatest challenges of the spiritual life is to be open to forgiveness. We could think of drug and alcohol abuse, all the fraud and stealing in the workplace, murders and violence, marital infidelity, priestly infidelity, all the tensions between people. Because of these and so many other things we could say we are like the younger son in need of returning to our Father. Lent is the perfect time to come back home. The most beautiful line the father says to the elder son is, "All I have is yours." Our heavenly Father says to us, "All I have is yours." This is a most beautiful promise and invitation. After the son has repented and committed himself to a new life, the father clothes him in a colorful robe. It was a sign that he was the same old son but he is a new son. The son cannot go back to the old ways, because the robe is a reminder of the new responsibility that the son accepts. The father is the human face of what we call mercy. Mercy is a restorative power. The prodigal son begins to see and experience himself as loved by his father. The parable of the prodigal son challenges us to behave like the merciful father and reach out first to those who has hurt us or grown distant from us, perhaps a family member or friend to take that first initiative. At various times in our lives it is easy to identify ourselves with one or all of these three characters. We've all been the aggrieved elder brother. We've also been in the shoes of the penitential son, who returns to begin all over again. We are all prodigal sons and daughters. But be sure of your willingness to start life anew. The Lord invites us as a loving Father to confess, to amend our lives, and to walk always in his paths. Each one of us can no doubt relate to this touching scene, one of the most beloved in the entire New Testament. We think of the excitement, the recognition of a loved one away for a long time, the tears of joy at the airport arrival section during a holiday season—or at any time of the year. Maybe it is a husband or wife, brother or sister, or child or grandchild returning from years overseas in the armed services or Peace Corps or seminary, as if he or she had been lost and now found. The return to the Father is ultimately the challenge to become like the Father in everything we say, to be rich in compassion and mercy to each and every person we meet especially to those distant from us. The merciful Father is always there to embrace and kiss us. The parable of the prodigal son indicates, however, that we do have the opportunity to make a change; we do not have to stay in our hopeless state; we can come to ourselves
