PALM SUNDAY
13th & 14th APRIL 2019

Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem begins Holy Week. We walk with Him, we suffer with Him, we die with Him and finally we rise again as new creatures. We gather outside the church where we hear the Gospel is proclaimed and palms are blessed and distributed. In this week we are offered rich symbols, gestures, objects, stories, prayer and music that lead us to the saving journey of Christ. This Sunday is also called as Passion Sunday. In all these weeks of Lent, we have prepared ourselves for the final week by fasting, prayer and charity. The Mass focusses on Jesus' sufferings as suffering servant. The three days in this week changed the world. The Liturgy from Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday is called as "TRIDUUM".

Holy Thursday: After His entrance into Jerusalem Jesus instructed his Apostles to make preparations for the Passover meal. It was at that Last Supper that Jesus gave us as the Eucharist, the sacrament in which we receive the Body and Blood of Christ and are joined to His Sacrifice, the New Covenant between God and His people. That evening, each parish celebrates a single evening Mass. In that we recall the institution of the Eucharist, the washing of the feet and the commandment of love. Holy Thursday ends with a solemn procession of the reserved Eucharist to an altar of repose where we will be asked, just as the apostles were, to watch and pray with Jesus. I invite you all to spend at least some time before Jesus and pray.

GOOD FRIDAY: Today is the day of fasting and abstinence. The suffering and death of Jesus are given main focus with intense prayer on this day. It is a day to die to oneself so that we rise anew with Christ. Man feels guilty and then attempts to remove guilt through a conciliatory action. In the New Testament it is not man who goes to God with a reconciling gift but God comes to man in order to give the gift to him. Mass is not celebrated on this day. The Stations of the Cross are prayed at 3.00 P.M. and the liturgy of the veneration of the Cross will be at 6.30 P.M. Passion Gospel, intercessory prayers, veneration of the cross and the receiving the Holy Communion will be part of the liturgy on that day.

HOLY SATURDAY: The most ancient celebration of Jesus' Resurrection is the Lord's day, SUNDAY. This was celebrated from the Apostles' time. The Easter Vigil Mass is a rich moment in which we are drawn into Jesus' victory over sin and death. It begins in darkness and the fire is blessed and the Paschal candle is lighted from that blessed fire. EXSULTET is sung. Still in darkness we listen to the Holy Scripture readings from creation and to the Resurrection. There are 11 readings all together but we are asked to take at least five readings. The Easter Vigil Mass is the most fitting moment for the catechumens to be accepted as the new members of the church by giving them the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. We prepare ourselves to join with them and renew our Baptismal promises. On Easter Sunday we share the joy of the Holy Women who saw the empty tomb and sang "Alleluia". From Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, it is a journey of faith to be with the Lord in his passion and sufferings and we wait for this last day. If we have journeyed with Him through his sufferings and death, then Easter celebration will be a joyful event in your life because you are rising to a new life with Christ. So I invite all of you to enter into this Holy Week with love for Christ so that you may celebrate your own Resurrection with joy at Easter.
