MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

15th & 16th JUNE 2019

Today we celebrate the HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY. This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. The word 'Trinity' itself is not biblical. We cannot find this word explicitly in the Bible. We believe that the one God eternally exists in three Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one God, who is the Creator of heaven and earth, who is eternal, almighty, unchangeable, infinitely powerful, wise, holy and having the same nature and attributes and worthy of precisely the same worship, confidence, and obedience. In the 4th century AD, there was a priest by name Arius who taught that the Son is not equal to the Father but is creature and He is not divine. He is a man but not God. The Council of Nicea (AD 325) said: "He is Son.... Begotten not made, one in being, consubstantial with the Father". The Feast of the Holy Trinity is part of our faith and a mystery. It is not meant to be analyzed like in the case of St. Augustine had done and other theologians but a mystery to be lived. It is a mystery and a paradox. Yet I believe it is true. I can think of at least three reasons for believing in the Trinity: 1. The Bible teaches this doctrine. 2. Christians everywhere have always believed it. 3. No other explanation makes sense. If you try to explain the Trinity, you will lose your mind. But if you deny it, you will lose your soul. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is revealed in the Sign of the Cross, when we say: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Making the sign of the cross shows that we are followers of the Holy Trinity and we believe in the Trinitarian God. If you do it in public, it is an expression to the world that you believe in the Holy Trinity. When we make the sign of the cross, we profess that we belong to the family of God and that the God we worship is a Father to us and we belong to the Body of Christ, the Church. Our body is the temple of the Holy Trinity and the Holy Spirit. All Christians believe the doctrine of the Trinity. If you do not believe this, you are not a Christian at all. You are in fact a heretic. Those words may sound harsh, but they represent the judgment of the Christian church across the centuries. Christians in every land unite in proclaiming that our God eternally exists as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Christians don't believe in three Gods. Second, we don't believe that the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit are three "forms" of God. Third, we don't believe that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are "parts" or "pieces" or God. The Bible contains numerous statements regarding the unity of God: Deuteronomy 6:4 tells us that "the Lord is one." 1 Corinthians 8:4 adds that "there is no God but one." 1 Timothy 2:5 explicitly says "there is one God." All Christians affirm this truth. The Bible also contains clear statements regarding diversity within that unity. God said, "Let us make man in our image and likeness". If we could explain God, he wouldn't be God. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. By the sacrament of Baptism, we are called to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity. Every week when we recite the creed we renew our faith in this doctrine of Holy Trinity and worship one God in the Trinity without dividing the substance. Let us reflect and meditate on the our profession of faith and let us not doubt but ask for the grace of the Holy Spirit to believe in this doctrine of faith.
