PARISH NEWS

When you enter a waiting place at the airport you find people waiting. Some will be chatting with friends, others reading a book and others busy with some other things. But one thing is true. They all wait for one thing that is to board the plane. Every Christian waits. In our concrete situations we ignore the coming of the Lord or we forget about it. Readiness to meet the Lord at his coming should be our everyday concern. The parable of today's gospel focuses on the unpredictable return of Jesus and our need to be prepared for his return. Most of us believe in preparation for many uncertainties but not with the most important event of our lives. We carry a spare tire in our car as preparation for a flat. We have insurance in preparation for a theft, fire trucks in preparation for a fire. Airline stewards provide pre-flight instruction in preparation for turbulent weather and we seek education in preparation for a good job. Preparation in our society is a sign of wisdom. The return of Jesus is a certainty. We can never know precisely when he will return or when we will die but his return is certain. We must constantly watch, being always faithful and ready so that we may be found worthy to share in the heavenly banquet he has prepared for us. So the point is about being prepared for his coming and ready to receive him whenever he comes. In the road of life which we follow, there are many uncertainties and distractions. We don't know where the road will take us; we don't know when it will end. But one thing is certain. At the end of life's journey; our Lord will be there to meet us, to welcome us into the heavenly kingdom if we have prepared ourselves. We must keep our lamps burning and our faith must shine. Happy are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Jesus rewards our faithful waiting. It is better to live in readiness even if he comes late than to be caught unprepared. We must open ourselves to God and to others. How can one be prepared in this matter? Jesus talks about the last judgment. We have to complete the task entrusted to us every day and be at peace with and at the service of our neighbor to be ready for his second coming. God loves faithfulness and rewards those who are faithful to Him. It means keeping one's word or promise and commitment no matter how difficult it gets. "Be on guard," Jesus says. At the moment of death, the state of our soul will remain basically what it is for the rest of eternity. Keep Jesus and his teaching constantly before your eyes. The most living experience of meeting our Lord is in the Eucharist. He is with us giving Himself in the bread and wine. We become one with him in the Eucharist. Let us always prepare ourselves to receive him both in the Eucharist and at the end of times like the five wise virgins to go with him.
